LAISSEZ SHOWING REAL INTENT

This week **Q of N** hosted **Laissez-Faire** in a match where both managers went for the 3-5-2, with the hosts opting for a zonal marking system to go with their formation. Visiting manager **McAuley** had decided he would be better of assigning individual marking, and sent out **Thyssen** and **Neuhaas** with orders to close down **Tidmarsh** and **Finzberg** throughout the match, a job they both did well. With the hosts also having to do without the injured **Todd**, this left **Laissez-Faire** well in control of proceedings, in fact they were so dominant that goalie **Matthieu** seemed to think his services would not be required, and did look like he had put some earplugs in his ears and started listening to some music in stead of following the game. This led to a goal totally against the run of play, as **Q of N** forward **Ould Daddah** showed his talents, picking up the ball deep inside his own half, easing his way past a couple of the opposition, and then playing a lovely ball over to the left, with **Thompson** free on goal, and with **Matthieu** engaged otherwise, he only had to side foot the ball into the net. This woke **Laissez** up a bit, as for all their possession they hadn't really looked lethal enough in the final third, but that now all of a sudden changed. Straight from the restart they went on the attack, and after a three minute bombardment of the **Q of N** area, **Cougas** got his head onto a ball drifted inside the box, and he crashed the header into the roof of the net for the equaliser. With their lead lasting for only three minutes it looked like **Q of N** lost what little belief they must have had of getting anything from the match, and it didn't take too long before **Laissez** got their second goal, to go 2-1 up, with **Cruise** crashing in a long range drive from all of thirty yards, as the ball flew into the top right corner with **Kalambero** without a chance of reaching it. For the rest of the match the home goalie somehow did manage to keep anything put at him out of the net, to keep the score at a very flattering 1-2 for the hosts. The visitors should really have had at least three or four more goals if you consider their total dominance, so hopefully the final standings of the season won't be hurt by their failure to score here. On this kind of form I doubt they'll fall short on goals, and they really look like they're on their way to a title.

Skelmersdale, and manager **Lawton**, are still top of the pile though, as they this week managed to pick up a rather fortunate win away at **D.D.T.** Both teams also here lined up in 3-5-2 formations, and had manager **Condon** done his homework, his side would surely had come out the better of this meeting, but failing to do any kind of marking job on their opponents, the great marking from **Gomelt** on **Delaney** did enough damage to his side to leave **Skelmersdale** in with a chance, despite **Jaipur** failing to trouble his intended target **Matilda** at all. As possession was very evenly balanced, we got very few chances, but already in the 8th minute **Silva** had to pick the ball out of the net, as **(Z)Murphy** was put through with a long pass up from defence, and he chipped the ball over the on-coming goalie. **Bensson** doubled the **Skelmersdale** lead in the 83rd minute, as he fired in a close range shot. **D.D.T.** didn't manage to get a single shot on target until **Boston** got them a consolation goal in the 90th minute, placing a free-kick into the top left corner. With some marking from the hosts the outcome here would surely not been three points to the away side, but lucky points count as much as the more deserved ones, and when managers don't do their work, it tends to cost dropped points, as manager **Condon** found to be the case here. ***** **Flamengo** keeps up their undefeated start to the season with a 0-0 draw, but at home to **System Lords** this is two points dropped rather than a point won. Despite some good man marking from **Rowlands** and **Raoul Moat**, on **Oleg** and **Yoragz** respectively, while no marking from the hosts, it was **Flamengo** that had the better of play on all areas of the pitch. Still they failed to make their dominance count in the goal column, and had to settle for the draw. Good tactical point for **System Lords**, bad from the hosts. ***** Elsewhere **Zion Gardens** picked up a 2-0 win at home to fellow strugglers **Beruit FC**, while **Walton Rangers** and **St Johns** somehow ended 0-0, as both teams had more than enough chances to get a couple of goals, but the draw fair on both teams. In the final match **Wycombe** got a deserved win over local rivals **Crosspit**, as they produced lots more in front of goal than what their visitors managed.

GOLDEN SEASON FOR SILVA?

Silva City, under their new regime, continues their great start to the current season, and at home to **Kirkwood Albion** they are helped out by their opponent's choice of fielding an untried combo of youngsters at the back. The hosts themselves played a well balanced 3-5-2, but seemed to lack the ability to break down their opponents, and only managed to get slightly more than a handful of shots on target. But with the ability of the back two of **Kirkwood**, that was more than enough, and the hosts ran out deserved 3-0 winners, but might try/need to be a bit more adventurous against better goalies. ***** A surprisingly defence minded **Ameliehekeani** only managed to get a goalless draw from their visit at **Primal Paragons**, to leave **Silva City** four points clear at the top. The visitors lined up in a SW-2-5-2, with manager **Molloy** giving orders of keeping all men behind the ball at all times, and also with zonal marking against their lowly opposition. Still they managed to produce the better chances of the match, and how the overweight and out of form **Skovsted** managed to keep a

clean sheet tell more about the awful finishing from **Ameliehekeani** than about the goalies performance, as most shots where straight at him (seems that his physical condition almost functioned as a magnet, drawing the oppositions forwards attention so much as they only managed to focus and fire shots straight at him, might be a new kind of tactical masterstroke from the deputy manager?). ***** **Tudor Avenue** climb up to 3rd, a point behind **Ameliehekeani**, as they ease to a well deserved win at home to **Crimson Dynamo**, despite the visitors taking a 14th minute lead. 5-1 might be a bit flattering though, and most goalies would have kept the score line down to 2 or 3 against. ***** **Hatchend Heroes** had no problem getting a win at home to **Real Santiago**, despite some very good marking from **Lefte** and **Diarra** against **Kanoute** and **Bogato (V)**. The lack of any marking from the hosts, led to the match being far from as one sided as the score line suggest, but **Von Cramm** did nothing to help his team out, twice dropping soft shots allowing opponents to poke the ball home from almost on the goal line. ***** Pre-season

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favourites **Faarevejle Utd** this week entertained fellow promotion favourite **Sporting Stars**, but as the visitors for some reason opted for a young sweeper and a fresh and untried man in midfield, we never got the close match that was predicted. It was all **Faarevejle**, and only a great display from **Boa Morte** kept the score at 2-0. Still only in 5th, and all of seven points behind the leaders, but now only three points behind 2nd placed **Ameliehekeani**. ***** A surprising formation chosen by manager **Barrett**, as his **The Showboats** went for a SW-3-4-2 away at **Dow Crag Rovers**, and despite their zonal marking and defensive approach, the man to man marking from **Nielsen** and **Collison** on **Ping Pong** and **Brooklyn Spice**, led to this match being a very one sided affair with regards to shots on target, with the visitors not managing a single one. But with **Sucre** and **Jambo** keeping it tight at the back, the visitors still manage to pick a point, as the match end in a goalless draw. Had **Dow Crag Rovers** not been without the injured **Ailsa** we surely would have seen another match, but with the tactics chosen by the visitors, this must still be seen as two points dropped by the hosts.

ROYAL BEATING

With both teams missing regular first team players, most noticeably **Verus** of **West London**, both teams played with an untried youngster in their team. The hosts sacrificed strength in midfield, with **Carroll** getting a run out with the big boys, while **Sebastian** got to try out his skill as a sweeper for the visitors. Neither manager saw fit to employ any kind of marking, and with the hosts lining up in a 3-3-4 against the visitor's SW-3-3-3, both teams had to mostly rely on their defenders getting forward to create what little they could, although **Royal Spurs** also got some chances from their four man forward line, as manager **Cranfield** missed out on a chance, not employing the offside trap here (a 3-4-3 with offside would surely have been the way to go?). The hosts had the better of play, and they managed to get some decent shots on **Verulamium**, and in the 71st minute the visitor's goalie got beaten as **(G) Inccie** scored from a towering header at the back post following a corner. With the visitors not being able to test **Gomes** on a single occasion, 1-0 is how the match ended, and this win lift **Royal Spurs** up into 4th, while **West London** drop from 4th to 6th. Just a minor hick-up for my pre-season favourites, our have I over rated their manager's acumen? ***** **Putney Celtic** entertained **Balderton FC** in one of the other big matches of the week. The hosts lined up in a rather attack minded 3-5-2, while **Balderton** came in a more midfield oriented SW-2-5-2. As the match played out, I'm sure manager **Presland** must have realised that a 3-5-2 with offside would have been the better choice here, as that would have at least thwarted some of the chances created from the host's forward line, and some marking would surely not have hurt in one form or the other. As the match got played out, it was all **Putney**, from start to finish, but for some hopeful long range shooting from the **Balderton** midfielders, and the game ended in a well deserved 2-0 win for the hosts, to lift them up into 3rd, swapping places with **Balderton** that drop down into 5th. ***** **Red Star** played hosts to **Bolton Tigers**, and their 3-4-3 was a tad defensive, and also got hurt by an effective zonal marking from their visitors, but they still had by far the better of play, as **Bolton Tigers** had to do without their injured midfield maestro **Anderson**. This resulted in a match where the hosts produced some good openings, and with Kowalski having to pick the ball out of his net three times, while we down the other end failed to

see any action in front of **Grosicics**. The visitors surely not helped out by the fact that they fielded two youngsters, but this match was probably one for the hosts no matter. ***** At the start of the season I warned that **Terra Firma** might get dragged into a relegation battle, although I felt they should be too good for it. Still early days, but now they are into the relegation zone, after they got deservedly beaten at home to previous leaders **Arsenal 1866**, who themselves dropped to 2nd due to their inability to score, letting **Red Star** climb to the top on goal difference. **Terra Firma** lined up in a very defence minded SW-3-4-2, with a well working zonal marking to go with it. Still the visitors had far the better of play, although they had to rely mainly on their defenders getting forward to help out with the creating of chances. Had **Terra Firma** played with **Ahlfors** in defence and with **Shere Khan** up in midfield rather than defence, and combined this with employing the offside trap, they would probably have been better off, but it might still have been to big a task keeping **Arsenal** at bay. As it was, **Arsenal** got a well deserved win, but they lacked any real sting in their finishing, leaving them to a single goal win. ***** **Barnet** takes advantage of **Terra's** loss to climb out of the bottom three, as they ease to a win away at **Ipswich Blues**, but somehow they only manage to get a single goal from all of their chances. ***** At **Fenham** the hosts trash bottom team **Tameside** 3-0, **Levi** not up to the task, but the win was deserved enough for **Rovers**.

RUSTING DIAMONDS?

Rustin Diamonds came into their match at **Luton Lions** with five wins from five matches, but more than once their wins had been more down to luck and margins in their favour than due to the caretaking management's tactical choices. Last week manager **Allen** stepped in and led them to a win over local rivals **Wath Dearnesmen**, but he only got them to score once in a match where they dominated throughout. This week their inability to take their chances led them to dropping their first couple of points of the season, as they failed to find a way past **Meyer** in the **Lions** goal. The hosts lined up in a 3-5-2, as did **Rustin**, and this combined with some good man marking from **Kinshasa** and **Hellstrom** on the two **Lions** attackers, left their hosts without a single chance produced. The problem for **Rustin** though, was that they themselves was left with a too well balanced team, with only their midfield gaining any real dominance over their counterparts, and they would surely have profited more on taking **Loren** out of the game completely than concentrating on the forwards. As it was they did only create a handful of chances, and none of them really troubled **Meyer**. This has to be seen as two points dropped, and next week manager **Allen** will be in for a harder opponent, when his team travel to **G.M.I Seville**, for what might be an early decider to the final come end of season? ***** This week **G.M.I Seville** themselves stumbled, at home to **Southdown FC**, a team that so far had showed no real sign of being the outside promotion bet I had them down as. The hosts lined up in a rather attack minded 3-4-3, while manager **Hails** sent his charges out in a 4-4-2, that only lacked a bit up front to match their opponents almost spot on. This led to a match of very few chances, and neither goalie let in any of the few shots they had to deal with from open play. The decider was a penalty, awarded to **Southdown** after a clumsy challenge from **Babidos** on **Eckstein**. The **Southdown** forward didn't look to be in control of the ball, just inside the area, but as he tried to turn towards goal, **Babidos** came clattering into him, and as **Eckstein** fell to the ground as a sack of potatoes, the referee decided there had

been enough contact to award a penalty. Up stepped big man **Morten Bo-Jens**, and he made no mistake from the spot, securing what can be a massive three points to kick-start the **Southdown** season. ***** **Sky Blue Fire** climbed to 2nd spot, getting away with the three points after a very fortunate win at **Wath Dearnsmen**. The referee twice awarded a penalty to **Sky Blue**, both times the decision at best looked dubious. Some better planning, not trying to play it through the middle on the muddy field, would surely seen **Wath** getting enough chances and goals to make the two penalties only a minor irritation, but as they failed to get their possessional advantage to count in the goals column, the visitors get away with the win in a match where they really failed to create anything apart from those two gifts from the referee. ***** At **Armani Casuals** there are no signs of any improvement, and how **Univ.Nanterre** only won this match with a single goal is a bit of a mystery, although when playing the whipping boys of the league, do you really have to keep all men behind the ball at all times?? ***** **FC Barca** climb to 4th after a well earned win at **Newtown FC**, and they might be able to keep up with the other teams at the top now that it seems they've got a new manager in? ***** **Fatal Flops FC** line up in a defence minded SW-3-3-3 at home to **Lang Gah**, with the visitors even more defence looking in a 4-4-2. Still it is the visitors that dominate the match, as they go on the attack from both defence and midfield, and it is only a good **Ruddock** that denies them the win here. At least the point should give some reason for joy for the hosts, but the physio staff and **manager Hudson** won't be too happy with all them injuries inflicted on them in this local derby.

UP FOR THE CUP

2nd ROUND HIGHLIGHTS

After seeing the draw, I said that **Real Santiago** for once would be favourites, as they hosted non-league **Southport**, but after seeing them drawing 0-0 at home, I really fear for them when they now have to go to the non-league team in the replay. ***** 2nd division strugglers **Ipswich Blues** are no match for the high flying **Lords**, and had it not been for an amazing performance from **Cooper**, there could at least have been double the amount of goals for the **Lords**. ***** Not surprisingly **manager Barret** change back to his preferred 3-2-5 for their visit to struggling **Armani**, and they cruise to a 5-0 win, **Dmitrov** doing great to keep the score decent looking. ***** **Silva City** entertain **Red Star** in a tight match between two teams in form, with some great marking from **Antonescu** and **Burns** levelling things up on the pitch, and we get an entertaining but goal less draw. **Silva** will have to do better at **Red Star**, or I think the 3rd division team might sneak through. ***** **Flamengo RJ** should be cruising through against **Balderton FC**, but for all their possession and all their chances, they only manage to beat the combo of **Kronenbourg** and **Soth** once, and then just six minutes after finally taking the lead, goalie **Callaghan** fumbles when collecting from a corner, and **Whootang** stabbed home the loose ball from half a yard out. **Flamengo** should still ease through this tie at **Balderton**, but some tactical changes might tip the balance a bit the other way in the replay? ***** A well worked zonal marking from **Rustin Diamonds** at **Skelmersdale** restricted their hosts, but the 1st division leaders still have much the better of play, and ease to a 4-0 win. ***** **Margate** beat fellow non-leaguers **Enfield**, and will be every other teams dream draw for next round. ***** **Laissez-Faire** gamble a bit, playing rookie **Cajtoft** between the sticks, but as **Terra** never get even close to him, the two goals from **Cruice** and **Ramsey** see them through 2-0. ***** **Barnet FC** give **Wycombe** an early scare, but with **manager Stevens** playing **Padraicins**, an untried youngster picked up from the street outside the stadium, between the sticks, **Wycombe** had no problem banging in the goals to ease through. ***** Kirkwood Albion are yet another team playing an untried youngster between the sticks, as **manager Johnstone** for some reason saw his cup match a fit place to give some youth a run out. The choice of playing **McCrudden** in goal and **Armstrong** in the sweeper's position, combined with a defensive SW-3-4-2 formation, led to his team only narrowly edging the match. The slightly more attack minded 3-4-3 of **Crimson Dynamo** left the visitors with some chances, and against that dreadful youth combo at the back, **Wallace** got them the winner in the 70th minute. Just makes you wonder what manager are thinking of, as a cup run surely should be seen as a good thing, and not

something you throw away to get some youngsters playing, especially when your really should be able to go through at full strength.. ***** **Crosspit** played out a very even match with their hosts **Ameliehekeani**, but they sorely missed **Mboma** to get that edge that might have had given them enough belief to put them through. In stead their manager opted for a rather defensive tactic, not allowing his team to venture forward, and combined with their well worked zonal marking, this did restrict the hosts to rather few chances from open play, but when being defensive and having a massive midfield, why then don't also go for the offside trap? That would have worked a treat here, as the three men from **Ameliehekeani** surely would have been caught offside time and again. In the end it might had counted for nothing anyway, as **Ameliehekeani** scored a handful, and mostly as a result of individual efforts, but still why not go all out negative and not just halfway there? ***** Great result for **Dow Crag Rovers**, as they deservedly win 1-0 at home to 1st division opposition, and that even without letting the visitors muster a single chance throughout the match. ***** **Sporting Stars** are yet another team with a goalie not fit for 1st team football getting a run out in the cup, what on earth is going through these manager's heads? No marking as well, and even with a solid back four, they can't keep **Putney** at bay for a whole match, and after **Stam** managed to poke the ball home after the youngster dropped the ball after collecting from a corner, it is only a question of how many. ***** **Q of N** came into their home tie against **Tudor Avenue** as slight favourites, but some good man marking on **Tidmarsh** even things out, and had **Col O'Leprechau** managed to do a better job on **Thompson**, things would have looked even better for the visitors. Still they managed to get as many shots on target as their hosts, and with **Kalambero** and **Kaka** both looking fairly comfortable throughout, the match ended 0-0. **Tudor** will now surely fancy their chances in the replay at theirs. ***** **Univ. Nanterre** manages to keep the score at 0-0 at home to **St Johns**, but the 1st division side will surely be cruising through at home. ***** Non-league **Hastings** are on the back foot from the off at home to **D.D.T.**, but still it somehow end 0-0. **D.D.T.** won't complain I guess, a money generating replay at home, with the chance of scoring at least a handful if not more.

LEAGUE CUP HIGHLIGHTS

3rd ROUND 1st legs

The Showboats lined up in a SW-4-3-2 at home to **Skelmersdale**, with **manager Barrett** once more going against his philosophy of attacking football. Had this formation been combined with some good marking, it might have worked, but as it was, they looked more than tight enough at the back, solid in the middle, but so weak up front that **Skelmersdale** managed to create their better chances from when their defenders ventured forward. Had the hosts been able to

switch one of their defensive men up into the middle of the park they would probably have been able to restrict their visitors even more, and had Jambo been at the top of his game they should really have been able to get a goal less draw here. As it was **Thomas** managed to get the visitors the only goal of the match six minutes before the break, but **Jambo** should really have been able to get to that shot. All to play for still, but I think **Showboats** have to do some tactical tweaks to get back into this one. ***** The match at **Crosspit** was lost by **Silva** due to one dreadful decision from their manager. The hosts lined up in their preferred 3-5-2, while **Silva City** lined up in a fairly balanced 3-4-3. With **Mbona** still out injured, it was **Silva** that had slightly the better of play, as neither manager saw fit for any kind of marking of trying to catch the other teams offside. What did change the potential of on of the team's goal scoring abilities here, was the decision of manager **Hudson** of telling his players to always keep all men behind the ball. This robbed his side for not far off ten chances of going forward, and surely with goalie **Jiang Pei** not being at his best, at least one or two of those chances could have ended with the ball in the net. Down the other end **Linka** also had a horrid match, as both goalies let in the only shots on them from open play, and thus it was an early penalty, in the 7th minute, that turned out to be the difference between the sides. Chance definitely missed here for **Silva**, and **Crosspit** know for sure they will have to do far better in the away leg if to win the tie on aggregate, but with **Mbona** back it is now theirs to lose. ***** Another good match for **Dow Crag Rovers** against **Zion Gardens**, this time at the 1st division teams ground. The 0-0 result fair enough, but on this and their cup showing, the tie is now surely going to go **Dow Crag's** way? ***** **Putney Celtic** have no trouble beating **Barnet FC**, and this tie look as it's already decided. ***** Very even in the match at **Red Star**, but while **Red Star** get a narrow 1-0 lead to take to **Tudor**, I feel this tie still can go both ways, and some tactical changes might turn the second leg into something much less even, in either direction. ***** **St Johns** try their best, but are never really looking capable of coping with **Laissez-Faire**, and the visitors take an easy 2-0 win back to their own ground, and should be planning for next round on this showing. ***** **Beruit FC** come to **Royal Spurs** with a 3-5-2, and against their host's 3-2-5 they miss a great opportunity not employing the offside trap, and shoot themselves even more in the foot, keeping all men behind the ball at all times. This changed what should have been a match with loads of chances for the visitors, from their dominant midfield, and hardly any shots for their opponents, as the offside trap should have got rid of many of those, into a fairly even match with regards to chances and shots on target. As **Temp** get beaten as early as in the 8th minute, the hosts only have to keep **Beruit** at bay, and 1-0 for the hosts is how it ends. Still all to play for here, but with better tactics I feel **Beruit** would already been through, and not facing a battle to get back in the tie. ***** **Faarevejle** put together a performance worthy of my pre-season predictions, as they are all over a not too bad looking **Arsenal 1866**. The visitors are flying high in their division, but had nothing on offer against a far superior **Faarevejle** side, and only problem/worry for manager **Jorgensen**, must be the lack of goals from their chances.

From now onwards we would like you to always write, 'don't sell if he turns star in the messages to GM box EVEN IF HE IS A LEVEL TWELVE STAR, as well as ticking the relevant DON'T SELL box in teampick. NOTE THAT TICKING THE BOX IS THE MAIN DECISION-MAKER IN WHETHER A PLAYER IS SOLD OR NOT, the GM Message is just to help the GM as during the transfers we have no way of knowing whether a player has become level twelve in THAT SESSION.!

Also PLEASE DO NOT leave partially-completed transfers in your transfer section, i.e. leaving the team name or the player, etc., it is laziness on your part and might result in strange things happening to your team!!!

And you MUST spell the names of the players included in any deal correctly. If you don't then the program might refuse them and they don't go through, so be careful.

In future, you are allowed multiple conditional bids from which the program will attempt to purchase just one item. However, you are also allowed multiple Unconditional bids from which the program will attempt to purchase all. teampick users just have to use the relevant boxes in the program, those who don't use teampick must ensure they stick to these rules and make it clear on their turns just what they want to happen in their bidding process.

LSO, be careful when doing deals etc. The program works on team order, which can cause problems.

Best idea is NOT to have 25 players in your squad at the start of a turn and do deals and sell to NL, cos if the manager you are doing a deal with has a lower team number than yours, the program will say you have no space in your squad, even though you are trying to sell players to the non-league. His orders will be processed before yours!!
